Declaration of RoHS Compliance and on WEEE Directive

Dear Sir or Madam,

The RoHS-directive 2002/95/EC restricts the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances) since 01.06.2006. The new Directive No 2011/65/EU (RoHS-II) extends the scope as from 22.07.2017 to include monitoring and control instruments in the industry.

eddylab GmbH operates globally as a manufacturer of sensor technology. Protecting the environment and our natural resources is one of our entrepreneurial principles, and it is a matter of course for us that we already comply with the environmental goals of the new Directive No 2011/65/EU today.

We can confirm that our entire product range is RoHS-compliant.

Directive No 2002/96/EC (known as WEEE or Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment) is aimed at reducing the amount of electronic scrap and to promote reutilization and environmental-friendly recycling. Directive No 2002/95/EC (RoHS I) and the WEEE Directive were together transposed into German law by the Electro and Electronic Equipment Act (ElektroG). According to the WEEE Directive, fixed installations or their components as well as prefabricated parts that do not represent independent units do not fall under its scope. Our products satisfy at least one of the above mentioned criteria and are therefore exempt from the WEEE Directive. For this reason, we are currently not planning any product labelling or registration with EAR, the national register for waste electric equipment.
